Here is your chance to gain recognition at the 2011 Oregon Society for Respiratory Care Conference and get in free for three days!

The Grand prize winner will receive a scholarship to cover the cost of taking the NBRC registry exams! This prize is worth \$390.00!

Second prize winner will receive a scholarship to cover the cost of taking the NBRC certification exam! This prize is worth \$190.00

The Third prize winner will receive a cash prize of \$100.00.

Admission to the conference will be free to any student who is a member of the AARC and is picked for presentation.

The **POSTER PRESENTATION** is your opportunity to:

- Be a representative of your school of respiratory therapy here in Oregon.
- Gain recognition from leading respiratory therapists, physicians, and other health care professionals in attendance at the meeting.
- Receive valuable feedback on your work given by conference attendees and judges who view your poster.
- Help the OSRC build a solid scientific basis for the profession of respiratory care. Every poster that is presented adds another important piece of knowledge to our profession.

Topics for the posters may include:

- A study; yours or someone you respect
- An evaluation of a method, device, or protocol
- A case study
- A literature review of a respiratory specific disease
- An interesting topic that you pick

Topic ideas may include aspects of adult acute care, continuing care/rehabilitation, perinatology/pediatrics, cardiopulmonary technology, or any respiratory therapy related health care delivery. Your topic is part of the judging, so be creative; **attract attention!**

Essential Content Elements

Study posters must include:

1. Title
2. A short paper (less than 500 words) with a title page that spells out the basis for your poster and includes the latest research or clinical practices that support the topic.
3. References
4. Visuals that relate to the topic

Poster Submission Guidelines

1. Posters must be written and presented in English.
2. The first line of the poster title page should be the title in all capital letters; the title should explain content and contain no abbreviations.
3. Follow the title with the name of the student, college, and location; underline the presenter's name.
4. Standard abbreviations may be employed in the text of the abstract without explanation; new or infrequently used abbreviations should be spelled out on first use and followed by the abbreviation in parentheses.
5. Use generic names only for drugs, if used; proprietary names may not be used.
6. Total word count for the presentation may not exceed 500 words. This does not include the title, picture captions or authors.
7. All components of the poster must be able to fit on a standard three-fold presentation poster board.
8. A maximum of two posters from each Oregon NBRC accredited respiratory therapy school allowed.
9. Each poster must be approved by the school's program director or director of clinical education.
10. The mandatory submission deadline is **January 7th, 2011.**

Poster Presentation Guidelines

1. Commercial logos are prohibited from appearing on the poster.
2. Authors are expected to arrive on time for their presentation and stand near their poster during the open hours of the Vendor Hall. Judging will occur on Thursday, February 3rd, 2011 and winners will be announced during the President's *Year in Review* presentation on Friday, February 4th, 2011.
